A LOCAL LAW FOR HAWKING AND PEDDLING IN THE VILLAGE OF ARGYLE

SECTION 1. Any person or persons, corporation or corporations shall not sell goods, wares, merchandise or any other article whatsoever by hawking and peddling except the peddling of meats, fish, fruit, dairy products and farm produce by farmers and persons who produce such commodities, without first obtaining a license so to do, to be granted by the Village Clerk. Licenses for such purposes as are in this section permitted to be licensed will be granted upon the payment of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) which will entitle such person to peddle or hawk for a period of four days.

Any person selling goods, wares, or merchandise from a cart, wagon or other vehicle shall not cause or permit such cart, wagon or other vehicle to remain in one place on any public street or lane, or in any public place for a period longer than fifteen minutes.

The advertising of any performance, business transaction or the sale of goods, wares or merchandise by crying the same or by the ringing of a bell or by any other loud or unseemly noise in the streets or public places of the village, is hereby prohibited.

Any violation of any of the provisions of this local law shall subject the offending party to a penalty not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).

Any violation of any of the provisions of this local law shall constitute disorderly conduct and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

SECTION 2 - SEVERABILITY. Should any section or provision of this Local Law be declared by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Local Law as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 3 - REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES. The Ordinance entitled,
"HAWKING AND PEDDLING" adopted on September 5, 1933, together with
all changes and amendments thereto, are hereby repealed and declared
to be of no effect.
